

Submission Requirements

Manuscript

- Manuscript must be submitted to Thomson Reuters via email in Microsoft Word format.
- Manuscript, including footnotes, should not exceed 10,000 words for articles or 1,500 words for section commentary. **Personalia** notes must not exceed 500 words. An abstract of 100-150 words must be included at the head of the article.
- Authors are responsible for the accuracy of case names, citations and other references. Proof pages will be emailed to contributors but excessive changes cannot be accommodated.
- You should disclose in your manuscript any financial or other interest, including appearing as counsel or as solicitor in any legal proceedings, which arises in respect of submission of the manuscript.
- You confirm that the manuscript is original, unpublished work that has not been submitted or accepted for publication elsewhere, including for online publication.
- In submitting the Contribution you warrant that the Contribution, and any part of it, is your original work, that you are the sole unencumbered owner of the copyright subsisting in the Contribution and that you have the right to grant this licence to Thomson Reuters.
