Security of payment legislation is designed to ensure, among other things, the rapid resolution of disputes in respect of payment claims under construction contracts. Such an objective requires every stage of the adjudication process to be temporally constrained. However, there is a crucial gap in the adjudication timeline of the East Coast Model.
